


The search function is accessible from the main page, as well as from a box on the top right side of every page in the database. A drop-down menu allows you to filter the search to a single database, including the armed forces, weapons, terrorism, and news and reports.



Weapons, Systems, and Platforms

This includes complete illustrated descriptions for over 7,500 weapons, systems, and platforms.

You are about to take control of the world's easiest-to-use, most up-to-date open-source military database. Containing over 7,500 weapons, systems, and platforms worldwide, this state-of-the-art research tool is written for professionals by professionals. All weapons are grouped by type, most with photographs and cross-referenced whenever appropriate. If an aircraft carries missiles, you can click from missile to aircraft with clearly marked links. Weapons are also linked to the countries that possess them.

1. On the users' home page, click on the Weapons link at the top of the page.
2. You are now on the Weapons/Systems/Platforms page. There are two menus: one showing the different weapon types and the other showing sub-types under a selected type. Click on Aircraft.

3. You now have 13 different categories of aircraft at your disposal. Click on the Attack category.

4. This brings you down to an alphabetical list of all of the available attack aircraft records. Scroll down, and click on the F-35 Lightning II.


This is where you take over. Each weapon has nine potential categories of information:

- **Description.** Purpose, design/appearance and structural components, subsystems, and weapons load.
- **Picture.** Many records include photos and/or line drawings.
- **Status.** Development history, contract awards, production status, and first flights/deployments.
- **Builders.** List of manufacturers.
- **Users/platforms.** Countries that operate equipment, platforms on which weapons, sensors, etc., are mounted.
- **Characteristics.** Weights, dimensions, propulsion systems, performance, sensor, and armament data.
- **Variants.** Developed variations, plus outlines of predecessor systems.
- **Issues/notes.** Major controversies, groundings/recalls, and user comments.
- **Operational notes.** Summary of combat operations.

Nations' Armed Forces and Orders of Battle

The researchers at Military Periscope begin by detailing the composition of land, sea, and air forces of every country, including equipment, personnel strength, and structure. Then, we add available information on deployment, plans, programs, and budgets. In the relevant cases, we report on each country's alliances, opposition, and paramilitary forces.

1. On the users' home page, click on the Armed Forces link.
2. You are now on the Nations' Armed Forces page. A list of 12 regions and organizations is provided. Click on Africa.



3. With just two clicks, you have drilled down to a menu of 45 African nations. Click on Tanzania.



4. All Armed Forces records in the database are organized by subhead to help you pinpoint the information you need. These can be navigated using the table at the top right of the page. Links at the top of the page take you directly to the orders of battle for individual services, such as the army and air force.

- **Overview.** Description of the country's military positioning, external/internal threats, and other factors affecting defense issues;
- **Armed forces.** Explains how a country's military branches are organized, numbers and strength of personnel, reserves, and conscription policies;
- **Equipment.** A system-by-system listing of the arsenal in each military branch, quantities in service, and a comparison with previous figures to help analyze buildups or drawdowns at a glance;
- **Deployment.** Lists bases, locations, and units stationed, if available;
- **Opposition forces.** Unique details on armed forces in conflict with the established military and their organization, strength, and equipment;
- **Paramilitary forces.** Equipment and strength figures for quasi-military armed forces, including naval auxiliaries, military police, special guard forces, and more;
- **Issues/notes.** Editorial insights into the country's defense positioning, including historical information; and
- **Plans and programs.** Details on future programs, including equipment purchases and development, defense requirements, budget fluctuations, and armed forces reorganization.

OVERVIEW

Tanzania, located on Africa's east coast, was formed by the union of the former British colonies of Tanganyika and Zanzibar. It shares land borders with Kenya to the north, Mozambique to the south, Malawi and Zambia to the southwest, and Rwanda and Burundi to the northwest. To the west is Lake Tanganyika, which it shares with the Democratic Republic of Congo. To the southwest is Lake Malawi, which it shares with Malawi. The Indian Ocean forms its eastern border.

It is a strong regional power, and has retained cordial relations with China, the West and with most of its neighbors. Tanzania is a member of the African Union, the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and the East African Community.

Tanzania maintains defense relationships with China, Uganda and Mozambique. It also has treaty obligations to provide military assistance and protection to the Seychelles.

Zanzibar, a pair of large islands and other small ones off the coast in the Indian Ocean, has historically enjoyed considerable regional autonomy but this has slowly changed as power has concentrated in the hands of President John Magufuli.

Tanzania's principle security threats come from violent poachers, piracy and terrorist groups, as well the threat of regional conflict spilling across its borders.

Regional Relations

Tanzania has a long-running but dormant dispute with Malawi over the border in Lake Nyasa (Lake Malawi) and the Songwe River. Tanzania claims that the border runs through the middle of the lake. Landlocked Malawi

International Terrorist Organizations

We've taken the same nuts-and-bolts approach to terrorism as we do with weapons and nations. We have added an open-source database of international terrorist organizations—from the well-known, such as Al-Qaida, Hamas, and Hezbollah, to the less publicized, such as Revolutionary Nuclei and AUM Supreme Truth. An interactive map locates the groups by region.

1. On the users' home page, click on the Terrorist Organizations link.
2. You can search by region using the interactive map or by the alphabetical list.



3. Click on Africa. You are now in the alphabetical list of all Africa-based terrorist groups. Click on Niger Delta Avengers.



4. Just like the Weapons and Armed Forces pages, the Terrorist Organizations pages can be navigated using subheadings listed at the top right of the page.

Stated Purpose
The NDA seeks greater investment and political representation for oil-producing regions in the Niger Delta region. It insists that more oil resources be used for local communities and has requested compensation for what it says are damages inflicted by oil producers over the years. The NDA wants self-determination and political autonomy for Nigeria's oil-producing regions. It has called for a restructuring of the country into independent federated units, where each unit would have control of the resources in its territory.

The NDA supports the Presidential Amnesty Program, which was established in June 2009 by then-Nigerian President Umaru Musa Yar'Adua. Its stated intention was to reintegrate militants into society by offering monthly payments, security contracts and vocational training or higher education. Critics, including the government under subsequent President Muhammadu Buhari, have denounced the program's high cost, its failure to alleviate poverty in the region and its susceptibility to corruption. Others pointed out that fighters who accepted amnesty received higher salaries than most Nigerians, making fighting more lucrative than most other jobs.






